

# Global Parliamentary Appeal for a Nuclear Weapons Ban

## ABOUT THIS APPEAL

Parliamentarians have a vital role to play in advancing the peace and security of a world without nuclear weapons. This appeal – coordinated by the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) – aims to build global support for a treaty banning nuclear weapons. The call for such a treaty has been endorsed by more than 150 governments, the United Nations Secretary-General, and the Red Cross and Red Crescent movement. Opinion polls around the world show overwhelming public support for a ban, including in nuclear-armed nations. This parliamentary appeal will be presented at various intergovernmental meetings aimed at promoting nuclear non-proliferation and disarmament.

Any current member of a national, state/provincial or regional parliament or congress may sign the appeal. It is open to parliamentarians from all countries.
